**MINISTRY OF COMMERCE AND CONSUMER PROTECTION**

The Consumer Protection (Maximum Price of Essential Goods) Regulations 2021 and the Rodrigues Consumer Protection (Maximum Price of Essential Goods) Regulations 2021 have been revoked with effect from 1 July 2022.

As from 1 July 2022, the under mentioned essential products will be placed under price control under the mark-up regime, as follows:

<b>Canned Fish</b> ( <i>Pilchards, Mackerel and Sardines</i> )	20%	2%
<b>Canned Tomatoes</b>	20%	2%
<b>Processed Cheese</b>	20%	1%
<b>Edible oil</b> ( <i>Soyabean, Sunflower and Vegetable Oil</i> )	22%	2%
<b>Margarine</b>	20%	2%
<b>Milk powder</b>	24%	2%
<b>Pulses</b> ( <i>black lentils, red lentils, broad beans, chickpea dal, split peas</i> )	24%	2%
<b>Pasta</b> ( <i>macaroni, spaghetti, lasagna, farfalle</i> )	25%	2%
<b>Wheat Cereals</b> ( <i>Breakfast Cereals</i> )	25%	1%
<b>Infant Food/Infant Food Preparation</b>	25%	1%
<b>Baby Diapers</b>	23%	2%
<b>Adult Diapers</b>	25%	2%

Importers concerned are requested to submit their returns of cost along with supporting documents for all consignments as from 1 July 2022. The returns should be submitted to the Price Fixing Unit of the Ministry through the Price Fixing Information System on <https://pfu.govmu.org>. New importers should register on the System first in order to submit their returns. A link to the manual is also accessible on the website of the Ministry on <https://commerce.govmu.org>.

The Consumer Protection (Consumer Goods) (Maximum Mark-up) (Amendment) Regulations 2022 is effective as from 1 July 2022 and is accessible on the website of the Ministry on <https://commerce.govmu.org>. Importers are requested to ensure strict compliance with the mentioned regulations, failing which appropriate action will be taken by the Ministry.
