

## Proposed Regulatory Impact Assessment on ban on plastic bags

In the EU-funded programme on Trade Regulatory Impact Assessment, requested by the MCCI, sponsored by the European Union, and implemented through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Regional Integration and International Trade, an impact assessment is being undertaken to determine the costs and benefits, both short- and long-term, on the proposed legislation to ban the use of plastic bags in Mauritius, similar to the ban that was imposed in Rodrigues in 2014. 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7. Do you believe the impact on large retailers and on small traders would be the same or different? Please indicate your reasons.<sup>1</sup>  
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8. How much of your raw material is sourced locally and how much is imported (2014 only)?  
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9. Do you use any recycled material in your production process? If so, please indicate the volume (in kg) of recycled material you used in 2014.  
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<sup>1</sup> It has been argued in other countries that consumers do more spur-of-the-moment shopping at small traders, therefore needing bags, and more “planned” purchases at large retailers, for which they may carry multiple-use bags with them.
